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OCLC

The Henry Luce Foundation has awarded the Online Computer Library Center (OCLC) a three-year US\$240,000 grant to create, in co-operation with the National Library of China, Beijing, a computerised catalogue of Chinese library materials from the Republican period - items published between the fall of the Q'ing Dynasty (1911) and the proclamation of the People's Republic (1949).

...Chinese staff will receive extensive training and hands-on experience in online cataloguing and data entry procedures. Chinese library staff will travel to OCLC to be trained in computerised cataloguing. They will remain in the United States to enter records from workforms created in the National Library of China by Chinese staff, trained and supervised by librarians from the United States. At the conclusion of the project, the National Library of China will receive a machine-readable tape of the completed bibliography for unrestricted domestic use.
