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### **ICS Ancient Chinese Texts Concordance Series**

The Commercial Press (Hong Kong) announces the First Series of the *ICS Ancient Chinese Texts Concordance Series* which was issued in 1992. The Series comprises sixty-five volumes of five series, the remaining titles of which will be published over the next four years. The Second Series with fourteen volumes will be produced during 1993 and 1994.

The Concordance Series is aimed at paleographers, linguists and historians, and provides a means of locating specific Chinese characters in specific titles, the frequency of use of each character in a particular text, and examples of how each Chinese character was used in ancient Chinese texts.
