Center for Electronic Texts in the Humanities (CETH) Newsletter 2(1) Spring 1994 has a report on Susan Hockey's trip to Japan in December 1993 for the International Conference on Building and Sharing of Very Large Scale Knowledge Bases. It includes some information about developments related to electronic dictionaries (Japanese-English-Chinese) and electronic text projects in Japan (mainly National Institute for Japanese Literature and NACSIS). There is also some information about artificial intelligence, etc. It is a very informative report on the conference.

UnCover Reveal

The UnCover Reveal Service is a table of contents notification service which UnCover has been offering without charge from April 1994. The charges come when you order an article from the journal. To sign up for the service contact the UnCover Company at uncover@carl.org -- many libraries probably have the sign-up instructions on their campus systems. It not necessary to give an account number or credit card number until you want to order an article from them.

There are many CJK vernacular journals in the file, but only the ones which have English translations of the tables of contents -- and notification is only from the English translated table of contents at this time. The entire database listing of titles is browsable to select the ones for which you want notification. Then you will receive the list of contents every time a new issue's contents are input into the UnCover database. It is a good way to find out what is being published in journals that you do not get at your own library. Even if you do subscribe to the journal it might not always be convenient to check on what is in the latest issue -- and this service can help with that too.

IFCSS CCIC (Chinese Community Information Center) has just added a new Internet service -- WWW (World Wide Web).

To access the web, run a browser, such as "xmosaic", latest "Emacs" and "lynx" which are available for free FTP from Xmosaic:

"ftp.ncsa.uiuc.edu:Web/xmosaic"

WWW line mode: "info.cern.ch:pub/www"

Emacs: "moose.cs.indiana.edu:pub/elisp/w3"

Lynx: "ftp2.cc.ukans.edu"

If you already have one of the above installed in your Internet-connected computer, you run it and see whether IFCSS CCIC is listed. If not, you "go" (xmosaic command) or "g" (lynx command) to

<http://ifcss.org:8001/index.html>

which is called the homepage and tells your software where to find us.

The rest is menu driven.

If you do not have any of the above installed, the easiest is to telnet (login) to the public accessible computers and run the software there. For example, telnet info.cern.ch (or telnet 128.141.201.74) The simplest line mode browser. This server is in Geneva, Switzerland.
