7. b) AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

On the China side, emphasis was still on the serial acquisitions especially those not commonly available through commercial channels. The most notable one was to complete our holding of Fu Yin Pao K'an Tzu Liao for the year 1983-1985.

The Library has a complete (or almost complete) set from the beginning up to 1982. However, because the title was subsequently banned for export, and made available again in 1985. With the assistance of friendly institutions in China, the Library was able to fill the missing gap and the set is available for consultation. The Library is also getting a complete microfilm set of Ta Ch'ing Hui Tien of Chia Ch'ing period which is unique outside China. In addition, the Library is also undertaking the filming of Tung nien lu, nien ch'i lu of all those which are not held by libraries outside China. A substantial number have been received.

For the Japanese collection, the following items were received during the year.

One of the most important children's literary magazines of its day, Akai tori included many famous writers among its contributors who aimed to present stories rich in artistic value with careful attention to the juvenile sensibility.

Naitō Konan (1866-1934) was an eminent scholar of Chinese history and taught at Kyōto University from 1907 to 1926. The so-called Naitō historiography was enormously influential among non-Marxist scholars and is still a principal feature of the "Kyoto school" of Asian Studies.

8. (Shinsan) Dai Nihon zokuzōkyō. Tokyo: Kokusho Kankōkai, 1984 - 50 vols. in progress. Text in Chinese.

This is a revised compilation of Dai Nihon zokuzōkyō (Japanese edition of the Tripitaka, the Buddhist canon proper) with new materials added and supplemented with separate volumes of cumulative table of contents, Indexes and bibliographical introductions in Japanese. It is also newly typeset with a number of improvements to facilitate easy reading.
